

Dress Code

You should always remember that being in a Christian school makes it necessary that your clothing is appropriate for where you are. It is not possible to list everything but the opening sentence in this paragraph should always be considered. The following are general guidelines:

This year we are going to try a few different things so please read carefully below for the changes. If this does work we will continue this for the years to come. If not we will go back to the old dress code of collared shirts.

BOYS AND GIRLS

Students (Preschool to 8th) - If hoods, hats or flip flops become a distraction or a sign of disobedience or rebellion, students may be asked not to wear them at all.

Flip Flops - Are only allowed on the First Friday of each month starting in September.

Hats - Are only allowed in the building on the First Friday of each month starting in September. The writing and pictures on the hats have to be appropriate for a Christian school.

Hoods - Will not be allowed to be worn in the building at all.

T-shirts with pictures/writing:

Allowed only on Fridays for K-8th and any day for Preschool & Pre-K. Messages on shirts should be consistent with Christian principles. Avoid extreme fad clothes. Most TV characters are not appropriate for display on shirts.

Preschool & Pre-K only:

You do not have to follow the following dress code the Preschool & Pre-K teachers want clothes that are okay to wear while doing different crafts and playing outside. However, still no holes should be in shirts, pants or dress. Shirts and dresses must come to the shoulders and shorts and dresses must be no more than 1" above the knees.

BOYS

Pants:

Pants should be worn with a belt or tie string – No sagging pants or holes in pants. Blue, black or tan twill pants and jeans are appropriate with no holes or frayed on the bottom.

Shorts:

Shorts may not be more than 1" above the knee. Shorts should be worn with a belt or tie string –No sagging pants or holes in pants. Blue, black or tan twill shorts and jeans are appropriate with no holes or frayed on the bottom.

Friday only - Nice athletic shorts and nylon sweat outfits with a tie string in the waist would be appropriate.

Shirts:

- Plain T-shirts (no writing, pictures or undershirts)
- Polo shirts
- Button shirts that are buttoned
- Sweaters

Note: *Sweatshirts, sweaters and t-shirts do not have to have a collared shirt underneath and must be long enough to be tucked in and shows no mid drift when you raise your arms.*

Friday only – Sweatshirts and T-Shirts with writing or pictures that are appropriate for a Christian school.

GIRLS

Pants:

Pants should be worn with a belt or tie string – No sagging pants or holes in pants. Blue, black or tan twill pants and jeans are appropriate with no holes or frayed on the bottom.

Shorts:

Shorts may not be more than 1” above the knee. Shorts should be worn with a belt or tie string –No sagging pants or holes in pants. Blue, black or tan twill shorts and jeans are appropriate with no holes or frayed on the bottom. Leggings are only allowed with shorts that is not more than 1” above the knee.

Friday only - Nice athletic shorts and nylon sweat outfits with a tie string in the waist would be appropriate.

Spandex is not appropriate & will not be allowed.

Shirts:

~Shirts must come to the point of the shoulder

- Blouses (material does not matter)
- Polo shirts
- Button shirts that are buttoned
- Sweaters

Not appropriate & cannot be worn – Spaghetti straps and low cut blouses

Note: Sweatshirts, sweaters and t-shirts do not have to have a collared shirt underneath and must be long enough to be tucked in and shows no mid drift when you raise your arms.

Friday only – Sweatshirts and T-Shirts with writing or pictures that are appropriate for a Christian school.

Dresses/skirts:

May not be more than 1” above the knee..

All splits in skirts and dresses may not be more than 1” above the knee.

No Spaghetti straps

Straps must be at least to the point of the shoulder

Leggings are only allowed with dresses or skirts that is not more than 1” above the knee.

DRESS CODE CONSEQUENCES

The best way for you to avoid dress code consequences is to be aware of and follow to the code described above.

First violation:

You will be instructed to call your parent(s) to bring an outfit that meets dress code. This is considered a warning. If you are unable have ‘code’ clothing delivered, HCS we will try to find an appropriate outfit for the day. (You may not like it, but you will have to wear it.)

Second Violation:

Same as first violation but you will have to stay in the office or detention room (supervised) and do your school work. This is sort of like in school suspension, but is not recorded as a suspension on your record.

Third Violation:

Same as second violation but you will get a zero (0) grade in all classes missed during the day. You will not be allowed to participate in extracurricular activities for two school days.

Four More Violations:

Principal will decide a consequence up to and including suspension.
